Taking a close look at actual nursing home fires, this course reviews the importance of a rapid, coordinated fire attack and rescue of any trapped occupants.

This course will take you beyond the dry facts and figures of your typical EMS CE program because hepatitis C is not about facts and figures; it's about people. Bob Family is one of those people. Until he retired with a still undiagnosed illness, Bob had spent 20 years with the Orlando Fire Department. He began his career during the era when responders didn't even wear gloves. Today, he is battling not only the disease, but also the system that many feel has turned its back on him. We spent several days in Orlando and captured Bob's story for a very important reason: he will likely be gone by the time you watch this course.
