A+	PULSE	NEW The National EMS Trauma Triage Decision Scheme	464-0310	30 minute video plus course materials	Every day, EMS providers make crucial decisions that impact the lives of their patients. One critical decision is where to transport patients, particularly those who have sustained traumatic injuries. Research indicates that patients with traumatic injuries have a 25 percent lower death risk when taken to a Level I trauma center versus a non-trauma center. The decision of where to transport these patients should not be taken lightly. Fortunately, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated the field triage guidelines to help EMS providers triage patients with the best option for survival. This course identifies and explains the updates made to the Field Triage Decision Scheme, originally developed in 2006.
A+	Firefighter Training	NEW Large Scale Hazmat: El Dorado Chemical Fire	463-0310	30 minute video plus course materials	Large-scale hazardous materials incidents present a number of challenges to fire and emergency personnel. This course explores a 2009 chemical plant fire in College Station, Texas, that involved more than 1,000 tons of agricultural chemicals and dozens of departments and agencies. Participants can use this real-world example to address concerns related to large-scale hazardous materials incidents.

In the second part of this series, we learn more about how to prepare for the worst. We tackle the top issues to address, including respecting confidentiality. Most importantly, Dan McGuire points out the logistical issues of a working pre-plan. Tune in and learn how to be a leader during a time when you need most to be prepared.

A+	Firefighter Training	Responding to Garden Apartment Fires	038-0206	30 minute video plus course materials	The term "garden apartment" encompasses a wide range of buildings that are generally classified as combustible, multiple-dwelling occupancies, which include garden apartments, row houses, town houses and other similar structures. Many motels and small office buildings that share the same construction characteristics should be grouped within this definition as well, and similar suppression strategies should be employed. When they are ablaze, these structures present firefighters and fire officers with a complex, strategic, and tactical situation with numerous safety concerns both for the responding agency and the buildings' occupants. This course examines the many issues surrounding responses to garden apartments, detached apartments, and condominium-style building fires.
A+	PULSE	PULSE: EMS and HIPAA	464-0108	30 minute video plus course materials	Every healthcare provider must comply with HIPAA, including emergency medical services providers. Many EMS providers are unsure of what does and does not violate HIPAA. This is complicated by the fact that most calls are conducted in public or semi-public environments, which can make it more difficult to protect a patient's healthcare information than in a hospital. This course answers many questions about HIPAA that EMS providers have, including such issues as how to comply with HIPAA when a citizen rides along with the crew, what health information can be handed over to police at the scene of an accident, and practical strategies for compliance out in the field
A+	PULSE	PULSE: Geriatric Patient Down	464-0607	30 minute video plus course materials	Approximately 25 percent of Americans will be 65 years of age or older by the year 2030 and will represent 70 percent of all ambulance transports. The geriatric patient is at a high risk of falling, which makes this one of the most common calls EMS providers will face, especially in locations with a large geriatric population. This course discusses why older adults are at increased risk of falls, common MOIs, and emergency treatment modalities for older adults.
A+	Firefighter Training	Propane Tanker Fires	700-0599	30 minute video plus course materials	While most fire departments can handle an overturned 18-wheeler or a Mack truck involved in a traffic accident, special training and preparation are needed for an incident with a propane-filled tanker truck. This course looks at two different instances in which propane tankers ignited and exploded. While the general situation is the same for both cases, the setting for each is completely different. Our goal is to revisit the past and compare the two situations so that you can be prepared should a tanker explode in your area.
