| <b>A+</b> | Firefighter Training | <b>Conducting Basic Fire Prevention Inspections</b>                    | 038-0909 | 30 minute video plus course materials | Fire suppression activities are not the only way to combat fires: a well-planned and executed fire prevention and inspection program is a less expensive and more effective way to accomplish the goal of the fire service. The goal is, of course, to minimize the risk of fire and property loss from fire. By observing, making recommendations, and subsequently controlling or eliminating hazardous conditions, the inspector can make major strides toward accomplishing this goal before a fire occurs. Fire inspectors must have the confidence in their ability to meet the public, to make a favorable impression, and to judge conditions.   |
| <b>A+</b> | American Heat        | <b>Hurricane Ike</b>   | 463-0909 | 30 minute video plus course materials | In September 2008, Hurricane Ike devastated Galveston, Texas. A category 2 hurricane with a category 4 storm surge, Ike resulted in catastrophic flooding 12 hours prior to landfall. In addition to coordinating mass evacuations, firefighters responded to more than 60 structure fires and performed more than 200 high-water rescues during and after the storm. Two stations and two fire apparatus were lost due to flooding. This course shares Galveston's lessons learned from Hurricane Ike, from pre-storm preparations to post-storm short- and long-term recovery.   |
| <b>A+</b> | PULSE                | <b>Stroke and TIA</b>  | 464-0909 | 30 minute video plus course materials | Stroke is the third leading cause of death in the United States after diseases of the heart and all forms of cancer. Your assessment skills, your ability to recognize the signs and symptoms of stroke, and the appropriate transport decision can mean the difference between life and death. This course reviews the anatomy and pathophysiology of stroke, defines proper assessment and management, and identifies the elements needed for a successful stroke care system.   |
| <b>A+</b> | American Heat        | <b>Massive Mutual Aid</b>  | 463-1003 | 60 minute video plus course materials | Firefighters working and training with other firefighters in neighboring towns is a common and widely practiced necessity between fire departments across the country. However, firefighters working and training with police officers, EMS providers, public works and city employees, and hospital personnel is a challenging task that is not as common. In times when cities are preparing and drilling for terrorist attacks, it is important for all public service employees to learn the value of mutual aid. This course demonstrates how the metropolitan areas of Chicago and Washington, D.C., rely on each other not only for these post-9/11 challenges but also for day-to-day emergencies. |
| <b>A+</b> | Firefighter Training | <b>Emergency Incident Rehabilitation, Part 2</b>                       | 038-3012 | 30 minute video plus course materials | The United States loses more firefighters in the line of duty than any other country in the world. The leading cause of firefighter fatalities is stress. With the changes in personal protective equipment, changes in types of response, and firefighters' drive to stay involved until the emergency is mitigated, the potential for casualties in the fire service is great. This course prepares firefighters to reduce the number of firefighter casualties by explaining the signs and symptoms of firefighter stress and heat-related emergencies as well as how to aggressively treat responders. Recent advances in firefighter rehabilitation are also covered.                                 |
| <b>A+</b> | Firefighter Training | <b>Building Construction, Part 3: Fire-Resistive Ratings for Walls</b> | 038-0042 | 30 minute video plus course materials | This course examines West Coast construction and compares how it and East Coast construction differ. Also covered is Type II construction, otherwise known as "non-combustible" or "limited combustible construction."   |

| <b>A+</b> | Firefighter Training | <b>Confined Space Rescue, Part 5: Equipment</b>             | 750-0005 | 30 minute video plus course materials | Demonstrations on how to properly assess the condition of the patient, the care and treatments of the patient on the scene, and how to properly package the patient for retrieval from a confined space environment are covered in this course.  |
| <b>A+</b> | American Heat        | <b>Marina Fires</b>   | 463-0403 | 60 minute video plus course materials | This course applies not only to coastal fire departments but also any department located near water, including streams, rivers, lakes, or oceans. There are unique challenges that fire departments face in a marina fire. This course takes a close look at those challenges and shows fire departments how to combat them. The course also shows participants how fireboats can play a critical role in fighting marina fires.   |
| <b>A+</b> | American Heat        | <b>Nightclub Fatalities</b>                                 | 463-0803 | 60 minute video plus course materials | Tragedy struck a small New England town in February 2003. When a band's pyrotechnic display sparked a blaze in a Rhode Island nightclub, 100 people died and nearly 200 were injured as the nightclub burned to the ground. Could this horrific event have been prevented? Does your department know what to look for when inspecting these types of buildings? This course takes a closer look at inspecting nightclubs. Miami Fire-Rescue and the Baton Rouge (LA) Fire Department take us along on real nightclub inspections to show you what to look for. |
| <b>A+</b> | Firefighter Training | <b>Managing the Fireground: Offensive/Defensive, Part 1</b> | 038-3021 | 30 minute video plus course materials | Becoming trapped in an offensive position on a defensive fire is one of the most common causes of fireground deaths and injuries. Being able to recognize the conditions that call for an offensive interior fire attack and those that call for defensive exterior fire attack are essential for success and survival. All personnel, leaders and subordinates, must understand their roles when this change of strategy order is given   |
| <b>A+</b> | Firefighter Training | <b>Vehicle Driving Operations, Part 1 of 3</b>              | 038-3031 | 30 minute video plus course materials | A fire apparatus operator remaining calm and focused while maneuvering through traffic is of utmost importance to both the crew and the general public. The fire apparatus operator is responsible for bringing the crew to the fireground quickly and safely. In this course, we join the National Safety Council for a discussion of the "cushion of safety."  |
