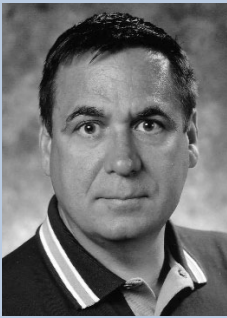

LETN to Deliver More Homeland Security Training in 2003

Our world changed on September 11, 2001! Our Congress now debates the merits of a massive proposal to create the Office of Homeland Security, focusing on the realignment of various federal agencies designed to detect, prevent, investigate, and respond to terrorist events. We have a new National Strategy for Homeland Security that sets forth additional directives for all federal, local and state police in our country.

The *National Strategy* states that while local and state law enforcement agencies will continue to investigate and prosecute criminal activity, they should now focus on preventing and interdicting terrorist activity. The strategy is clear: "We will redefine our law enforcement mission to focus on the prevention of all terrorist acts within the United States, whether international or domestic in origin" (pg. 26). Incumbent in this statement is the importance of developing a cooperative and sharing culture between and within agencies of federal, state, and local governments.

As a reflection of this significant change in American policing, LETN is proud to offer new content programming that focuses on addressing the issues and demands that are presented by this new challenge. Several of our popular programs will continue, such a *Roll Call* and *Spotlight*, however new coverage will begin in February 2003 that also includes the following:

...❖ **As police officers, we embark upon a new role that has heretofore been left to those in national law enforcement agencies and the military.**

- **First Responder:** A series dedicated to outlining the role of police, fire, and EMS in responding to potential terrorist threats. Many of these programs will stress the coordination of first responders to a scene through the implementation of the Incident Command System.
- **Protecting America:** A continuation of this popular show will feature new programs in vulnerability assessment that address the protection of critical infrastructure within the United States. The series will focus on the investigation of crimes that impact schools, water sources, industrial and manufacturing plants, communication and transportation hubs and other important infrastructure entities within your community.
- **Digital Crime-Digital Terrorism:** A completely new show focusing on electronic and financial crime, identity theft, Internet crime and fraud. This show will address such important procedures as identifying and securing digital evidence at the crime scene, understanding digital forensics, tracking child predators on-line, and protecting critical information infrastructure.
- **CSI – Crime Scene Investigation:** Re-emphasizing the importance of correct procedures in collecting and processing evidence at the crime scene, this series will include new shows on footwear and tire tread evidence, gunshot residue, blood spatter, ballistics, and other important forensic aspects involved in crime scene reconstruction for police officers and agents.
- **Homeland Security:** This series will focus on more catastrophic terrorism perspectives such as those posed by WMD (weapons of mass destruction) and bombings. This series will be much more expansive than the first responder series, focusing on issues arising from homeland security, such as intelligence gathering and analysis, bomb and blast investigation, the alert system, emergency preparedness, and handling individual incidents.

Our new focus does not mean an abandonment of those features that assist everyday officers in performing their duties. Rather, the new programming should be viewed as a complement to our excellent shows on tactical patrol and officer safety.

As police officers, we embark upon a new role that has heretofore been left to those in national law enforcement agencies and the military. Even though our nation is now threatened by a relatively new phenomenon, we should not dismiss the fact that police officers will continue to address the issues of crime and disorder that plague many of our communities. As such, we stand by you in addressing this new challenge. Indeed, we live in interesting times!
