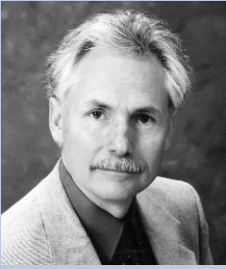


A TIME TO REFLECT

The holidays are upon us. A time for revelry, sharing, and for many, a renewal of deep spiritual commitment. For others, this time of year is a period sprinkled with anger, violence and depression. There will be families across this great land of ours that will experience deep emotional loss from the profound absence of a family member or friend who gave their life in service to others. Do we desire to enter the New Year no better prepared than we were in the last, with only the same rhetoric to explain our loss? We make excuses ... don't have time ... don't have the money. What then are we living for? To reflect upon the past? To envision the future? Perhaps to complain about the present. In the post 9/11 period agency budgets have become extraordinarily strained. Training periods have been truncated and personnel reassigned. For many, we look to the heavens for solace at this time of year. For all, we must focus our energies inward to determine who we are, how we can improve, and against what standard are we to be measured. Having passed the century mark again this year in law enforcement officer deaths, we must ask a foreboding question: Why? With all that history tells us, are we so caught up in the task of doing the "business" that we forget to focus on the process that allows it to be done? We are a decisive culture, but are we looking away from matters that are most important to us? Are we "dying" to leave a legacy?

The 2003 law enforcement challenge is to remain effective while becoming more highly mobile. Mobility requires redefining how the process of training will be conducted to allow the maximum amount of "street time." The most profound trend that we are experiencing at present is the "shift from providing training to improving performance." The focus of our training efforts has moved away from simply providing skills or knowledge and toward a focus on human performance improvement. The mobile force no longer sees learning as the only measurable output of training.

Traditionally, law enforcement training focuses on what people need to learn where the acquisition of skill and knowledge is the end. Likely, your entire academic career has been like that. Moving toward human performance improvement focuses on what people need to do where the acquisition of skill and knowledge is a means to an end. This is most effective for the highly mobile force. It requires, however, a superior involvement of both the front line supervisor and all FTO's to act as onsite trainers and leaders. We must include, but move beyond measurable tests of knowledge and into observable competency in the performance of the job.

In the dynamic, super-charged world of today, with technology outpacing human resource potential, front line officers must be in charge of their learning. Who better to decide what they will need to perform assigned tasks? The more traditional approach in learning is the instructor-led classroom session that all of us have experienced first at the academy level, then through in-service mandates. The unfortunate part about that model is that not everyone learns the same, at the same rate, and with the same degree of comprehension and retention.

Distance learning breaks from the traditional organizational model that primarily focuses on performance and qualifies a learning organization that places a greater emphasis on learning. Agencies with clearly defined reasons for adopting distance learning do so for one of the following rationales. First, to expand access and meet those learners who do not have much flexibility in their schedules. Certainly, this model meets the needs of the law enforcement community for all personnel who experience rotating shifts and assignments. Second, distance learning is "scalable," which means physical site capacity constraints are eliminated. All law enforcement personnel, through personal computers, satellite transmissions, or video/DVD technology, can now realize the "virtual" learning classroom. Next, this model can be used to capitalize on emerging professional opportunities in the criminal justice field. Imagine the demand for executive education, supervisory curricula and position specific programs for operational personnel. Finally, and perhaps most importantly, distance learning can serve as a catalyst for transforming the culture of an agency and stimulate its responsiveness to the needs of the public. This is, after all, at the core of the community policing effort.

The broadcasts will also be useful to local, State and federal administrators responsible for WMD resources and operations that may impact their communities.
